Important

Installing an inline (LAN Bypass) network interface card in Deep Discovery Inspector 530/1300 requires removing the appliance's COM port permanently. If you need the COM port for Deep Discovery Inspector's preconfiguration, Trend Micro recommends using Dell's iDRAC instead.

- **Inline (LAN bypass) network interface card**

Select the appropriate card according to the network throughput.
Supported cards:

- Dual Port 1GbE Copper Bypass Card for TLS Inspection
- Dual Port 10GbE Fiber-SR Bypass Card for TLS Inspection

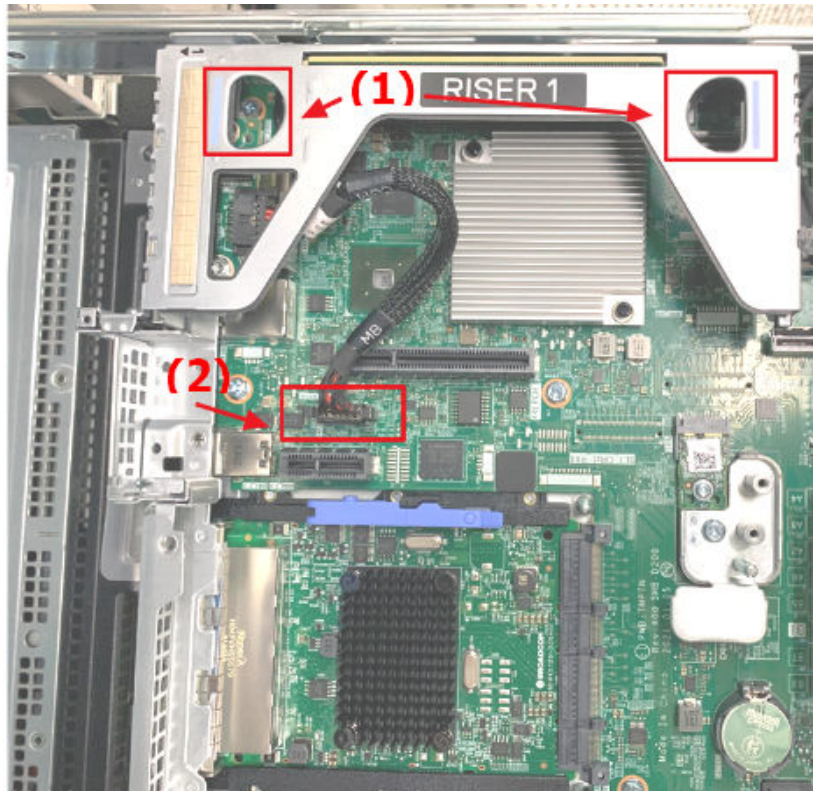
Installing the Inline (LAN Bypass) Network Interface Card

Procedure

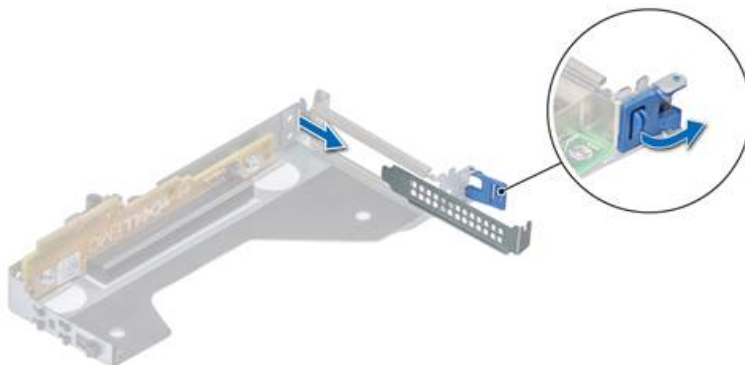
1. Shutdown Deep Discovery Inspector.

Go to **Administration** > **System Maintenance** > **Power Off / Restart** and power off the system.

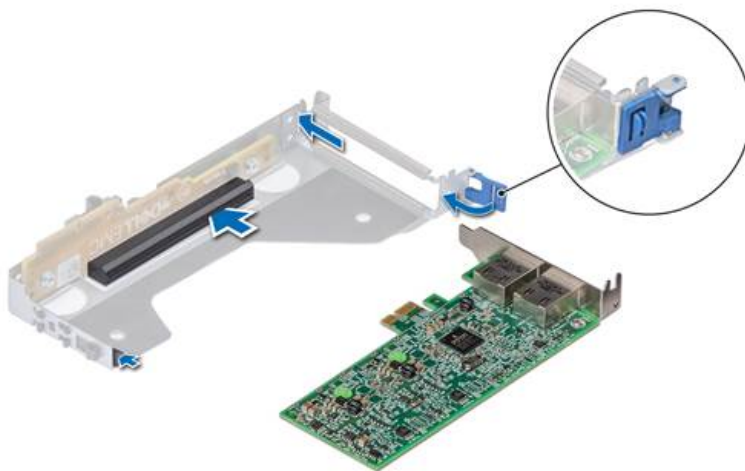
2. Disconnect the power cord from the appliance.
3. Install the Inline (LAN bypass) network interface card in the appliance
 - a. Remove the server's top cover.
 - b. (For Deep Discovery Inspector 530/1300 only) Remove the COM port from the appliance.
 - i. Hold the card riser from the sides marked with blue (1), then lift the card riser.
 - ii. Disconnect the COM port connector from the motherboard (2).



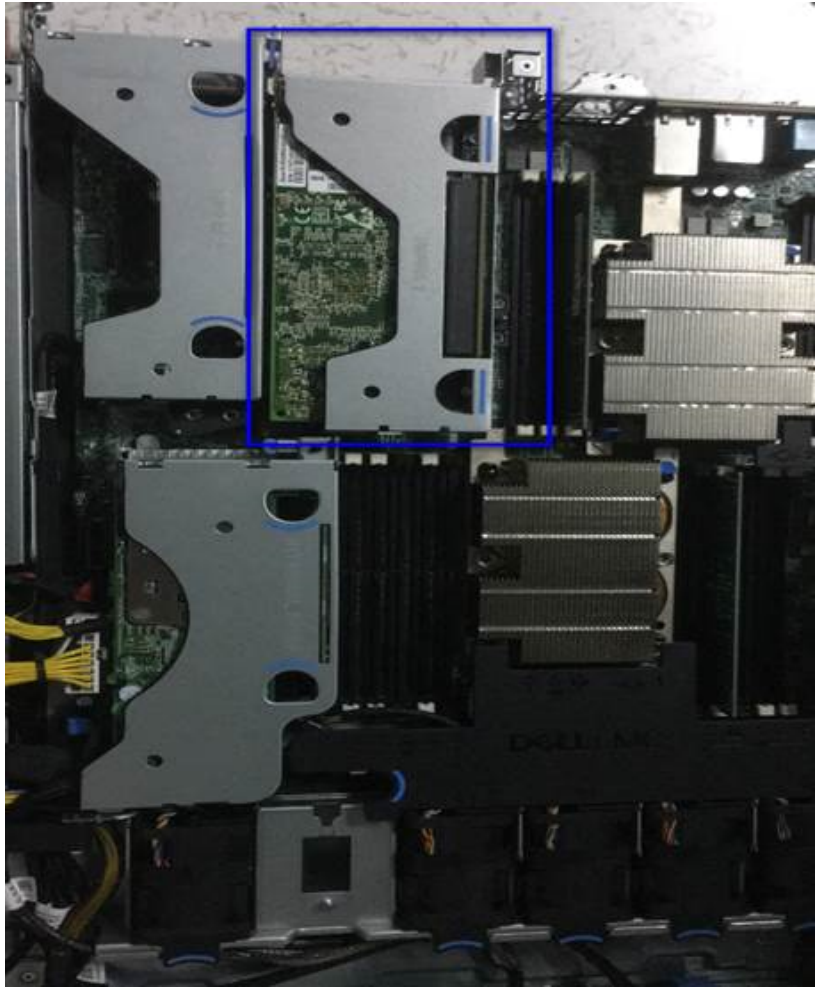
- c. Open the card retention latch and remove the PCI slot cover of an empty PCI-e slot



- d. Align the card with the server's PCI-e slot, push the card in firmly until the card is connected, then close the card retention latch.



- e. Secure the card holder to the server chassis.



- f. Close up the server.

Checking the Inline (LAN Bypass) Network Interface Card Status

After installing, check the card status on the Deep Discovery Inspector management console.

Procedure

1. Power on the appliance.
2. In the management console, go to **Administration > System Settings > Network Interface**.
3. Check the card status.

If the inline (LAN Bypass) network interface card is installed correctly, the **Inline Interfaces** section appears.

▼ Inline Interfaces


Inline interfaces provide uninterrupted network access when traffic can no longer flow through an interface.

Frequently Asked Questions

What Happens If Deep Discovery Inspector Enters Inline Appliance Mode?

Deep Discovery Inspector does not support inline and out-of-band deployment at the same time. If Deep Discovery Inspector was originally deployed in offline mode, enabling inline appliance mode stops network traffic monitoring from mirror ports, and only traffic flowing through inline ports is inspected.



Note

Traffic cannot be blocked by Deep Discovery Inspector. When Deep Discovery Inspector enters inline appliance mode, traffic is only inspected or not inspected

Which PCI-e Slot Should I Use to Install the Inline (LAN Bypass) Network Interface Card?

Trend Micro recommends using any empty PCI-e slot to install an inline (LAN Bypass) network interface card.



Important

Moving installed cards to different slots before installing an inline (LAN Bypass) network interface card results in unexpected configuration changes.

What Happens If the Inline (LAN Bypass) Network Interface Card Is Removed or If the Inline (LAN Bypass) Network Interface Card Stops Working

While Deep Discovery Inspector Is in Inline Appliance Mode?

Deep Discovery Inspector automatically switches to offline mode, and stops inspecting TLS traffic. All the events associated to this change are recorded into the system logs.
